Ryukoji-temple is called "Oinarisan of Mima" the local district. Everyone has friendly feelings towards it. It has a gateway to a Shinto Shrine.



Stone images of guardian dogs welcome people to this shrine. Images of stone foxes and little human faces "jizo" are also erected side by side. It is a rare temple with a mixture of Shinto images.
