KAZAKI KITES MUSEUM

IKAZAKI KITES MUSEUM

The Ikazakí Kíte is a symbol of uchiko Ikazakí. Several hundred kítes are flown in the sky every March 5th. It is called "Big Kites Flying Contest". This museum displays about 400 kites from Japan and around the world. You can experience kite-flying there.



RAKUSUI DAISHIDO

When KOUBOUDAISHI drank water in this area, his body became healthy, So people built Rakusui Daishido and prayed there.





KOKEMUSHIRO

It is a 400 square meter garden that was made by hand. In the garden there is a tearoom. And you can also take a walk while enjoying the moss carpet.



SUKUNAHIKONA-SHRINE

Sukunahíkona no míko ís a God who appears in Japanese mythology. He went to Dogo Hot Spring to recover. However, he drowned as he tried to cross Ozu Hiji Rver. Local people felt sorry for him so the built a shrine and buried him.

MEISEKIJI-TEMPLE

It was founded in 600. There are a lot of big ancient cedar trees. If you see them you will feel solemn. This temple is famous for the happy Kannon statue and the main hall's roof.



KAIMEI SCHOOL

Thís school building was built by townsfolks contributions in 1882. It has freign-made glass and arched windows. The inside was recreated to look like an old classroom. This building is an ímportant cultural asset of Japan.
